Preoperative Diagnostics

Full lab work (CBC, chemistry panel, and urinalysis) for all patients prior to general anesthesia is always appreciated.

SURGVET GO, INC. requires the following diagnostics within one month of any anesthesia.

- <2 years of age: PCV/TS, chemistry panel, urine specific gravity
- 2 to 7 years: CBC, chemistry panel, urinalysis
- 7+ years: CBC, chemistry panel, urinalysis, thoracic radiographs (3 views)
- Heart murmur: thoracic radiographs (3 views) or prior evaluation by a cardiologist
- Previous azotemia: CBC, chemistry panel, urinalysis within 48 hours
- Suspected neoplasia: thoracic radiographs (3 views)
- **Cruciate cases:** Mediolateral & Caudocranial projections of the stifle from the distal femoral diaphysis to proximal metatarsus. Flexion of both the stifle and tarsal joint at 90 degrees is preferred and allows for TPA measurements.

Additional diagnostics may be recommended or required for individual patients due to case specifics.
